- 2 Green Beans


Here's how:

- 3) Spread the beans out on the cotton wool. Place it somewhere where it has enough sunlight.
- 4) Within 2 3 days, your bean will start to sprout and grow, watch what happens after!







Make your own midsummer wreath

You may need help from an adult assistant.

Materials:

- Flowers and leaves/greenery, string or thin wire, scissors.
- Ribbons and florist tape (optional)

If you are using fresh flowers and greenery, keep the wreath in the refrigerator until use. Spray it from time to

time with water.

step I

Start by making small flower bouquets. Make all the bouquets similar or create 2 - 3 different bouquets to alternate with. Estimate about 16-18 bouquets.

step 2

Keep the stems long in each of the small bouquets. This will create a sturdier wreath. Place the leaves and greenery beneath and flowers on the top. Bind each bouquet with a string or thin wire.

step 3

Take a long piece of wire and loop it around the bottom of each bouquet. Alternate, placing one bouquet to the left and one to the right. In this way, create a long "garland". When the "garland" is long enough to measure around your head, fit the stems of the last bouquet under the first bouquet and bind it into a round wreath. You may use ribbons or florist tape to cover the exposed stems.





Can the Sun Really Shine at Midnight?

Yes it can! Midsummer is the longest day of the year and in some parts of Sweden, when the weather is clear, the sun will be visible for a 24-hour period. Which means that when your watch shows 12 midnight, it may still be bright as day! This year, Midsummer's Day (or midsommardagen) in Sweden falls on 22 June.

What's your favourite food at the Midsommar feast?






Do you wear something special during Midsommar?

It has to be strawberry cake with plenty of strawberries and fresh fruit syrup – yummy!



Who do you usually celebrate Midsommar with?





Yes, girls wear the Midsummer wreath (*midsommar krans*), which is made of wild flowers or leaves, or both. We all wear this during this celebration. Whoever is free will go to pick wild flowers around the area where the party is held. Most of the time, the girls will follow their mums or dad to collect the flowers. They will also help to make the *krans* after they collected enough flowers and leaves.





It must be really special to have the sun shining at night, isn't it?

Yes! I feel very happy when the sun shines at night. Nobody feels like going to bed! It's very special because I get to go to bed much later than usually, probably around 10pm.



Fun facts about Midsommer

- Girls and young women are supposed to pick seven different species of flowers and put them under their pillow, and that night, they will dream of their husbands!
- Streets in the city are usually empty around Midsummer because many people head to the countryside for celebrations
- There is lots of singing, dancing and games at a Midsummer party!



did you know

Since it's Midsommer and all about celebrating a longer day time with a lot of light, let's talk about the Sun!

The sun is the largest object in our solar system

The sun is larger than all of the planets. Its radius is approximately 432,000 miles. This almost 109 times as large as the Earth (whoa!).

The sun is really, really hot

The outer part of the sun is about **50 times** hotter than the temperature of water boiling. It is so hot that if we were to put any kind of metals there, it would not only melt, but be vaporized on the sun.

The sun is about 70% hydrogen and 28% helium

The core of the sun converts hydrogen to helium. So basically, the sun is a large ball of gas. Poof!

The surface of the sun has lots of eruptions


Giant flames erupt from the sun's surface caused by sunspots. Some of these eruptions are even bigger than the Earth!


The sun has dark spots known as "sunspots"

While you cannot see them without special equipment like a telescope, the sun has some dark areas, called sunspots. These spots appear darker because they are about a 1000°C cooler than the surrounding gas.


It takes 8.3 minutes for light from the sun to reach the Earth


When you see the sun, you are actually seeing what it looked like **8.3** minutes ago. It takes that amount of time for light to reach the Earth.




















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
